



## Nick Gallus

Nick is Special Counsel at Lipman Karas, where he represents States in arbitrations and in enforcement proceedings before Australian courts, and advises investors and States on treaty protections in Australia and abroad. He recently returned to Australia, after working overseas with boutique arbitration firm Three Crowns and with the Canadian Government. He acted as lead counsel or counsel, for claimants and for States, in many investor-State arbitrations and negotiations of treaties, including the CPTPP. He lectures in international arbitration at Monash University and his writing on investment treaty arbitration has been published in leading international academic journals. His most recent book on international disputes, *The Temporal Jurisdiction of International Tribunals*, is published by Oxford University Press.
